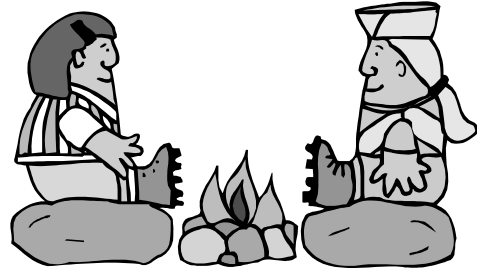


# 4th Annual All-School Campout

**Where:** We will be camping at Canoe Harbor State Forest Campground, located about 14 miles east of Grayling, MI, a 2 ½ hour drive north of Howell.

**Who:** Open to all KWHS students - new students are especially encouraged to attend. The adult leaders will be Kensington Woods teachers and staff. Parents are welcome to attend and siblings are welcome with a parent.

**Cost:** \$45 per student which includes food, campsite, canoe, and KWHS T-shirt. Partial camperships available – call Gail at the KWHS office.
